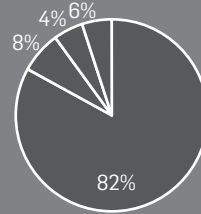

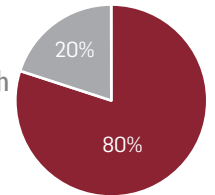

The high school curriculum is that of a U.S. college-preparatory school. Instruction is given in both English and Spanish; **80%** of all academic courses in high school are taught in **English**. Most students pursue both the U.S. High School Program and the Guatemalan Bachillerato Program.

Grading:

The American School of Guatemala uses a 100 point scale. The GPA is the cumulative average of all courses from grades 9-12. Our school does not use letter grades (A, B, C, D, F). Please refer to the chart as a suggested interpretation. The weighted GPA reflects an additional 10 points per AP course. Grades are recorded each trimester (November, February, June). We do not rank students.

PBA Scholarship Program:

Each year, our school offers 25 full need-based academic scholarships to some of Guatemala's brightest local grade 11 students after a rigorous interview and entrance exam process. These students attend our school in grades 11 and 12 only and are immersed in our bilingual educational setting. These students will be graduated with the Guatemalan Bachillerato (High School) Diploma.
