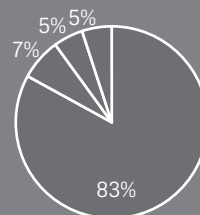

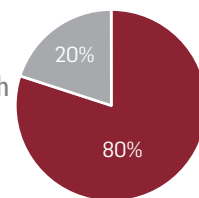

## Academic Program:

The high school curriculum is that of a U.S. college-preparatory school. Instruction is given in both English and Spanish; **80%** of all academic courses in high school are taught in **English**. Students pursue both the U.S. High School Program and the Guatemalan Bachillerato Program. Students take the Duolingo English Test (DET) and/or TOEFL which are available locally.



## AP Program:

AP courses are available to students in **grades 11** and **12** upon prerequisite completion and teacher recommendation.

AP Program Enrollment: **84% of Juniors and Seniors** are enrolled in one or more AP course.

### Grading:

The American School of Guatemala uses a 100 point scale. The GPA is the cumulative average of all courses from grades **9-12**. The weighted GPA reflects an additional 10 points per AP course. Grades are recorded each trimester (November, February, June). We do not rank students.

### PBA Scholarship Program:

Each year, our school offers 25 full need-based academic scholarships to some of Guatemala's brightest local grade 11 students. Students are accepted into this two-year program after a rigorous interview and entrance exam process. These students are instructed primarily in Spanish but immersed in our bilingual educational setting. It is expected this cohort of 25 students will be graduated with the Guatemalan Bachillerato Diploma.
